STAY HOME WHEN YOU ARE SICK / SYMPTOMATIC


Symptoms include:



Main symptoms include Cough, Fever (99.5 degrees+), Difficulty Breathing, & Loss of Taste and/or Smell For a full list of symptoms, please visit the CDC's COVID-19 symptom webpage.

TIMELINE AFTER A POSTIVE COVID TEST RESULT OR SICK / SYMPTOMATIC

Required timeframe: If an individual does not test, <u>a full 10-day isolation is required</u>. If you are willing to test, you are able to return to work sooner. See sample timeline below.

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU TEST POSITIVE, REGARDLESS OF VACCINATION STATUS:

Tested COVID-19 Positive with Symptoms (Symptomatic)



Isolate

You must stay home until: At least 5 days have passed since your symptoms first started and you have a negative viral (Antigen Test) COVID-19 test collected on day 5 or later and you have not had a fever for at least 24 hours and your symptoms are improving and you must wear a well-fitting mask for 10-14 days.

-OR-

At least 10 days have passed since your symptoms first started and you have not had a fever for at least 24 hours and your symptoms are improving and you must wear a well-fitting mask for 10-14 days.

Day 0 is the first day of symptoms. Day 1 is the first full day after your symptoms developed.

Test COVID-19 Positive with NO Symptoms (Asymptomatic)



Isolate

You must stay home until: At least 5 days have passed since the day your initial positive test was taken and you have a negative viral (Antigen Test) COVID-19 test collected on day 5 or later and you must wear a well-fitting mask for 10-14 days.

-OR-

You must stay home for 10 days after your initial positive test was taken if a negative test is not submitted by Day 10. Once you return you must wear a well-fitting mask for 10-14 days.

Day 0 is the day your positive test was taken. Day 1 is the first full day after your positive test was taken.





WORK):



3 Keys to Staying Safe

Monitor Your Health

Monitor your health for symptoms of COVID-19 for 10-14 days after your last exposure. If you develop symptoms, you must isolate and test immediately.

Mask Up

Wear a well-fitting mask while around others, indoors and outdoors, for 10-14 days after your last exposure.

Maintain Your Physical Distance

Maintain six feet of distance from others for 10-14 days or as far apart as possible
